GAME NOTES

Gusties Take To Gridiron For 97th

Season... The Gustavus football team is now in its 97th season in 2013. Over the previous 96 years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 467-335-21, including a record of 215-122-8 in St. Peter. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 93-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (31) has claimed more MIAC championships.

Follow The Gusties On KNUJ... KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota will once again broadcast all ten Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler will handle the play-by-play duties for the eighth consecutive season. Wheeler will once again be joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. In addition, Gustavus will once again video stream all home games for viewing on your computer and portable internet device through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. Calling All Captains... Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 97-year history of the program, only 188 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Torey Asao, Beau Bachman, Jeffrey Dubose, David Gschneider, and Lyle Opdahl.

Senior Leadership... With 22 seniors on this year's squad, the Gustavus roster features the fourth-most seniors on any Gustie football team in the last 20 years. The 2003 (28), 2002 (26), and 2011 (23) teams are the only three squads during that span to have more seniors wearing Black and Gold. This year's senior class features four offensive linemen, three wide receivers, two running backs, and two tight ends from the offensive side of the ball, while the defense features five defensive backs, four defensive linemen, and two linebackers.

Gustie Football Around The Globe... The 2013 Gustavus football team features a total of 107 players from nine different states and, for the second time in the last four years, a second country outside the United States. Of those 107 players, 93 claim Minnesota as their native state. A combined four players call Kansas home, while one player each hails from California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. Mexico also makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of three Gusties, all of whom hail from Cancun.

The Series... Saturday's game marks the 72nd ever meeting between Gustavus and Augsburg in football. The Gusties hold the upper hand in the all-time series with a record of 54-17. However, it has been all Auggies as of late, as Augsburg has won five out of the last six meetings, including a thrilling final-second victory last season in St. Peter. With just :10 seconds remaining and Gustavus leading 24-20, Augsburg quarterback Ayrton Scott heaved a prayer towards the end zone. The ball came down into the hands of teammate Hakeem Bourne-McFarlane, who carried several Gusties across the goal line for the game-winning touchdown and a final score of 26-24.

Meet the Head Coaches... Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his fifth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 14-27 in his first four-plus seasons. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus. On the other sideline, Augsburg Head Coach Frank Haege is now in his ninth season at the head of the Augsburg football team. A graduate of UW-Stout and former offensive coordinator at Augsburg, Haege returned to the Auggie football program in 2005 after a brief stint as a head coach in the Arena Football League (AFL) from 2000 to 2002. In his eight-plus years as head coach since returning to Augsburg, Haege has compiled a record of 34-47.

About Augsburg... The Augsburg football team enters Saturday's match up having last played a game two weeks ago on Sept. 7th. In that game, the Auggies exploded to score 51 points and rack up over 600 yards of total offense in a 51-17 rout of Concordia (Wis.). Augsburg amounted 606 total yards on the day, which stemmed from 309 yards rushing and 297 yards passing. Quarterback Ayrton Scott led the way offensively with 197 yards rushing to go along with two touchdowns. Through the air, Scott completed 16 of 24 passes for 285 yards and two more touchdowns. Scott's favorite target was Joey Sonnenfeld, who hauled in six catches for 113 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, the Auggies allowed 353

yards of total offense, which included 147 yards rushing and 206 yards passing. However, the key statistic for the Augsburg defense came in forcing five turnovers: three interceptions and two fumble recoveries. The Auggie defense was led by Michael Juberain, who recorded 10 tackles, two of which were for losses, to go along with a sack and a forced fumble. In the secondary, Hakeem Bourne-McFarlane notched two interceptions.

Gustavus In MIAC Openers... For 93 years, the MIAC has sponsored football, 90 of which Gustavus has been a participant in the conference. The Gusties were banned from the conference during the 1941 season and suspended MIAC play during the 1943 and 1944 seasons due to war efforts. During those 90 years, Gustavus posts a record of 370-240-13, which includes a record of 53-35-2 in MIAC season openers. Gustavus' first MIAC contest was in 1920 when the Gusties fell at the hands of St. Olaf by a final score of 14-0.

Back-To-Back Challenges... After holding a Simpson offense that had accumulated over 600 yards of total offense the previous week to under 300 yards in last week's win, the Gustavus defense will face another test in containing the Augsburg offensive attack. The Auggies, similar to Simpson, racked up 606 total yards in their season-opening win over Concordia (Wis.). After leading the league in total offense with an average of 471.2 yards per game last season, Augsburg is once again tops in the conference in total offense so far this season. Quarterback Ayrton Scott poses as a threat both on the ground and through the air, leaving the Gustie defense with its hands full for a second straight week.

Big City Livin'... While some people prefer the big city life, the Gusties can say no such thing when they travel away from the confines of St. Peter to Minneapolis in recent years as Gustavus has lost on each of its last three trips to the big city. During that span, all three of its losses have come at the hands of Augsburg. The last time the Gusties beat the Augsburg in Minneapolis was on Oct. 9th, 2004 in a 34-21 win.

Big Third Quarter... Tied 7-7 at halftime last Saturday, the Gusties outscored Simpson 21-0 in the third quarter in what

St. Thomas recorded its second win of the season last Saturday: a 25-7 decision over UW-River Falls. Paul Graupner provided a spark in the kicking game, going two-for-two on point-after-attempts and making his lone field goal try, a 41-yarder in the fourth quarter. Graupner also provided a field position advantage for the Tommies, sending one kickoff into the endzone and two more inside the 10-yard line.

proved to be the difference in the 28-21 victory. Gustavus scored touchdowns on three straight possessions to open the half, the first of which was an 11-play, 69-yard drive that took 4:38 off the clock and was capped off with an 11-yard touchdown run by Jeffrey Dubose. The next two scoring drives each required less than a minute of game clock, both of which lasted just two plays. Mitch Hendricks made quick work on the first of these two drives with a 53-yard touchdown run on. Just over a minute later, the Gustie offense got the ball back with just nine yards to go to the endzone. It was Hendricks who scored on his second rushing touchdown of the day to give the Gusties a 28-7 lead.

While the Gustavus offense totaled 170 yards and scored three touchdowns in the third, the star of the quarter was the Gustie defense. Gustavus allowed just 21 yards of total offense in the segment, while holding a dangerous Simpson offense scoreless and forcing a turnover inside the Storm 10-yard line. The turnover led to what would become the game-winning touchdown.

Dubose Eclipses 2,000... With an 11-yard touchdown run early in the third quarter last Saturday, running back Jeffrey Dubose surpassed the 2,000-yard rushing mark for his career. Dubose became just the 11th player in the history of the Gustavus football program to reach the milestone and currently sits 11th on the all-time career rushing list with 2,035 yards. With 45 yards on Saturday, Dubose could leap into the top 10, passing Scott Anderson '92, who currently ranks 10th with 2,079 career yards rushing.

Solid Debut... In his first start as a Gustie, quarterback Mitch Hendricks accounted for 279 yards of total offense and two touchdowns. The sophomore completed 27 of 42 passes for a completion percentage of 64.3 percent. Those 27 completions combined for 222 yards through the air, while throwing one interception. He also carried the ball nine times for 57 yards and two scores on the ground. To top it all off, Hendricks became the fourth Gustavus quarterback since the 2000 season to win his debut wearing the Black and Gold. Hendricks joins Sean Smith '04, Jordan Becker '10, and Muresuk Mena '12 as the only signal-callers of the century to do so.

Ground And Pound... The Gustavus rushing attack has had success in recent years against Augsburg. The Gusties have rushed for an average of 213.2 yards per game against the Auggies over the past five years, including a 354-yard performance in 2008. In that game, Ray Wilson '09 carried 28 times for a Gustavus record 258 yards to go along with two touchdowns. The ground game has also produced 10 touchdowns over the five-year span for an average of two per contest.

MIAC Off To Fast Start... With a combined 12-1 record amongst its members, the MIAC has accumulated the best record of any conference in NCAA Division III College Football so far this season. The MIAC began the year 7-0 before going 5-1 last weekend. The only other conference to begin the year undefeated was the Liberty League, whose members went a combined 6-0 in week one. With a 5-2 record last weekend, the league now posts a combined record of 11-2 this season.

By The Numbers...

2,000: The number of career rushing yards running back Jeffrey Dubose surpassed last Saturday. Dubose became just the 11th player in Gustavus football history to do so.

53: The number of yards on the longest play from scrimmage last weekend, a 53-yard touchdown run by Mitch Hendricks.

4: The number of turnovers the Gustavus defense forced against Simpson. The Gusties forced and recovered two fumbles and also intercepted two passes on the day.

4: The number of rushing touchdowns the Gusties scored in last week's win. Jeffrey Dubose and Mitch Hendricks each ran for two scores on the afternoon. It is just the third time that the Gusties have rushed for four or more touchdowns in a game in the last five seasons.

11: The number of receptions by wide receiver Phillip Butler last weekend. Butler caught 11 passed for 53 yards in the contest. His 11 catches are the most in a single game by a Gustie since Sept. 18th, 2010, when Muresuk Mena caught 10 balls for 60 yards and a touchdown against Northwestern.

St. Peter, Minn. – The Gustavus football team suffered a heartbreaking 26-24 loss to Augsburg College on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. With just :10 seconds remaining and Gustavus leading 24-20, Augsburg quarterback Ayrton Scott heaved a prayer towards the end zone. The ball came down into the hands of teammate Hakeem Bourne-McFarlane, who carried several Gusties across the goal line for the game-winning touchdown.

Augsburg improves to 2-0 overall and 1-0 in the MIAC with the victory, while Gustavus is now 1-1 overall and 0-1 in the MIAC.

If football fans attended today's "St. Peter Day" game expecting big offensive numbers, they were certainly not disappointed in what they witnessed. Augsburg totaled 475 yards (192 rush, 283 pass) and Gustavus racked up 438 yards (199 rush, 239 pass) for a combined 913 yards of total offense.

The first quarter was nearly entirely consumed by two long drives by each team. Augsburg took the opening possession 67 yards on 12 plays, eating up 7:26 before missing a field goal from 30 yards out. Gustavus then capitalized on the next drive with a Tom Huepenbecker (Sr., Middleton, Wis.) 19-yard field goal (3-0) that capped a 15-play, 77-yard drive that took 7:14.

It would take until the :13-second mark of the second quarter before points were put on the scoreboard again. Gustavus capitalized on a forced fumble by safety Beau Bachman (Jr., St. Peter, Minn.) that was recovered by linebacker Joe Haas (Jr., Mission, Kan.) at the Augsburg 22-yard line. Quarterback Muresuk Mena (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) found Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) on a three-yard slant to put Gustavus on top 10-0. It was Hintze's first career touchdown, as the sophomore would finish the game with 53 yards on five catches.

Augsburg would take back the momentum on the ensuing kickoff and head into the locker room trailing 10-7. After catching the kick on the 18-yard line, Bourne McFarlane reversed his field several times and dodged multiple tacklers before seeing daylight on the far sideline. Picking up a convoy of blockers, he took the ball 82 yards for the score.

Gustavus' offense gained a total of 179 yards of total offense in the first half, while the defense came up with two fumble recoveries and allowed 162 total yards.

After Gustavus failed to score points inside the red-zone on the opening drive of the second half, Augsburg went 86 yards on six plays to score a touchdown and grab its first lead of the game at 14-10. Scott found tight end Adam Carl on a skinny post from 28 yards out for his first receiving touchdown of the afternoon.

The Gusties answered on the next drive with a touchdown of their own, taking the lead back at 17-14 with 5:24 left in the third quarter. Mena connected with Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) on a bubble screen at the 12-yard line and the junior receiver leaped into the near corner of the end zone for his first touchdown of the year.

On what looked like to be sure points in store for the Auggies on their next drive, sophomore safety Jake Forcier (Watkins, Minn.) came up with a key defensive play that kept Gustavus in control of the lead and the ball at the start of the fourth quarter. After Augsburg's Carl was wrapped up following a short catch-and-run on the far sideline, Forcier ripped the ball from his hands at the ten-yard line and returned it to the Gustavus 21.

The Auggies came up with a turnover of their own on the next drive when Kaleb Williams picked off Mena with 7:02 left in the game. Augsburg turned the interception into points five minutes later when Carl redeemed himself with his second touchdown catch of the

game, putting the Auggies up 20-17 after the extra point attempt was missed. Carl led all receivers in the game, making nine grabs for 101 yards and two touchdowns.

With 2:13 on the game clock, Muresuk Mena orchestrated a seven-play, 66-yard scoring drive that put Gustavus on top 24-20 with 1:04 left to play. For the second game in a row, Mena hooked up with Jeffrey Dubose (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) on the touchdown pass, hitting his running back on a wheel route from the 19-yard line.

The victory seemed all but sealed after Kellan Euerle (Jr., St. Cloud, Minn.) gave the Gustavus offense the ball back with :54 seconds on the clock after he picked off Scott on Gustavus' 42-yard line. This, however, was not the case, as Augsburg gained the possession back on its own 20-yard line following a Gustavus punt. Scott then marched the Auggies 38 yards in :24 seconds before his Hail Mary hookup with Bourne-McFarlane.

Both quarterbacks put their dual threat capabilities on full display at Hollingsworth Field this afternoon. Scott ran for 163 yards on 23 carries, and was 19-for-36 for 283 yards and three touchdowns through the air. His counterpart Mena ran for 80 yards on 21 carries, and was 19-for-27 for 239 yards with three touchdowns passing.

Gustavus' offensive line was once again superb, allowing just one sack and creating holes that led to 199 yards of rushing offense. Dubose finished with 70 yards on 14 carries, while Butler had 49 yards on six carries.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is entering his fifth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

In his fourth year as head coach, Haugen led the Gusties to a 3-7 record overall and a 2-6 mark within the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, finishing seventh in the league standings. In four seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 13-27 and an MIAC record of 10-22. Last season, Gustavus received four all-conference selections in running back Jeffrey Dubose (St. Paul, Minn.), offensive lineman Brian Grundmeyer (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.), defensive lineman Donte Green (Minneapolis, Minn.), and linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.). Dubose earned first team distinction while Grundmeyer, Green, and Haas all earned a spot on the second team.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference this past year and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early 90s. In his senior year, he earned All-Conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 96-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a .580 winning percentage (467-335-21). The Gusties will soon join a very elite group of 37 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games. Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 29 players who have received All-America honors, 12 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently in 2012, senior safety Brad Kruckeberg was awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

Trailing 7-0 late in the first half, the Gusties rattled off 28 unanswered points heading into the fourth quarter to take a 28-7 lead. Simpson did not go quietly, however, as the Storm scored twice in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven. In the end, the Gusties drained the remaining 2:29 on the final drive of the afternoon to hang on for the 28-21 win. Gustavus begins the season 1-0, while Simpson drops to 1-1.

“It’s a great feeling to win a football game,” remarked linebacker Joe Haas (Sr., Mission, Kan.). “We have been working towards this since last season, and to come out here and play like we did, it feels amazing.”

After an empty outcome on its first possession, Simpson drove the ball 74 yards in seven plays and 2:44 to take an early 7-0 lead. A pair of big plays on the ground from Ethan Calvert and Tyler Kenny for gains of 17 yards and 23 yards, respectively, highlighted the drive, which was capped off by an eight-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Taylor Nelson to Ryan Olson.

On Simpson’s next possession, Joe Haas recovered a fumbled snap for the first of what would be four straight turnovers between the two teams. The Gusties returned the favor two plays later with a fumble inside the Simpson five-yard line only to get it right back on an athletic interception by Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.). Three plays later it was Simpson’s turn to force an interception and the flurry of turnovers was finished.

Gustavus threatened on each of its next two possessions, but could not find a way to put points on the scoreboard until the final :26 seconds of the half. Following a pair of 20-plus-yard completions, Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) carried off right tackle for a two-yard touchdown run to even the score at 7-7 heading into halftime.

“I think we did a nice job of keeping our composure in the first half when we weren’t playing how we wanted to, especially on the offensive side of the ball,” mentioned Dubose. “We stuck with it and took the momentum when we scored at the end of the half.”

The 15-minute halftime break could do nothing to break the spirit of the newly rejuvenated Gusties. They proceeded to score on each of their first three possessions of the second half to open up a 28-7 lead midway through the third. On its opening drive following the break, Gustavus marched 69 yards down the field in 11 plays to score the half’s opening touchdown on an 11-yard run by Jeffrey Dubose. On the play, Dubose surpassed the 2,000-yard rushing milestone, becoming just the 11th player to do so in the history of the Gustavus football program.

“It means a lot to me,” admitted Dubose of his accomplishment. “A big reason why I have gotten this far is because of the coaches and my teammates. The coaches have kept their faith in me and my teammates have been willing to block for me. From the offensive line out to the receivers, it has really been a team thing. They put the yards in front of me and I just had to grab them.”

The Gusties needed just two plays on the following drive, thanks to a 53-yard touchdown run by quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) that extended the Gustavus lead to 21-7. After Xavier Fust (Jr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) recovered a fumble inside the Simpson nine-yard line, Hendricks scored his second touchdown of the day with a four-yard touchdown run.

However, Simpson would not go quietly. In a 28-7 hole, Simpson came back to score two touchdowns in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven points. The Storm scored on a 35-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to Mike Kuhn to narrow the lead to 28-14 before Taylor fired another touchdown pass to Nate Connealy.

“Simpson has a great offense, we learned that last year, and they showed it today when they scored two touchdowns in two minutes,” said Haas. “We held together as a defense and got the turnover we needed to make a stand on the goal line.”

In the end, however, the Gusties drained the final 2:29 with the final drive of the game to hold on for the 28-21 win.

“We came out and moved the ball the first few drives of the second half and rode the momentum,” added Dubose. “They came back at the end, but we just had to turn the page and get back on track. Sometimes you have lows during a game, but you have to stay steady. I think we did a good job of doing that.”

Gustavus was led offensively by Mitch Hendricks. In his first start as a Gustie, Hendricks completed 27-of-42 passes for 222 yards and also carried the ball nine times for 57 yards and two touchdowns. He was joined in the ground game by Jeffrey Dubose, who carried 22 times for 75 yards and two touchdowns. Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) led all receivers with 11 catches for 53 yards.

Defensively, Joe Haas recorded seven tackles, while also forcing a fumble and recovering a fumble. Jake Forcier (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) registered five tackles and an interception on the day.

The Gusties will be back in action next Saturday when they travel to Minneapolis to take on Augsburg at 1:00 p.m. Even with the win, Head Coach Peter Haugen knows there is room for improvement heading into next week.

“I think we need to play cleaner,” stated Haugen. “Offensively in the first half, there were plays to be made and we were close to making them but just couldn’t seem to figure it out. We ended up doing that in the second half, but we need to play cleaner from the start.”
