
GAME NOTES

Gusties Take To Gridiron For 97th

Season... The Gustavus football team is now in its 97th season in 2013. Over the previous 96-plus years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 469-336-21, including a record of 371-241-13 in conference play. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 93-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (31) has claimed more MIAC championships.

Follow The Gusties On KNUJ... KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota will once again broadcast all ten Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler will handle the play-by-play duties for the eighth consecutive season. Wheeler will once again be joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. In addition, Gustavus will once again video stream all home games for viewing on your computer and portable internet device through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. Calling All Captains... Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 97-year history of the program, only 188 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Torey Asao, Beau Bachman, Jeffrey Dubose, David Gschneidner, and Lyle Opdahl.

Senior Leadership... With 22 seniors on this year's squad, the Gustavus roster features the fourth-most seniors on any Gustie football team in the last 20 years. The 2003 (28), 2002 (26), and 2011 (23) teams are the only three squads during that span to have more seniors wearing Black and Gold. This year's senior class features four offensive linemen, three wide receivers, two running backs, and two tight ends from the offensive side of the ball, while the defense features five defensive backs, four defensive linemen. and two linebackers

Gustie Football Around The Globe... The 2013 Gustavus football team features a total of 107 players from nine different states and, for the second time in the last four years, a second country outside the United States. Of those 107 players, 93 claim Minnesota as their native state. A combined four players call Kansas home, while one player each hails from California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. Mexico also makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of three Gusties, all of whom hail from Cancun.

The Series... Saturday's game marks the 83rd meeting between Gustavus and St. Thomas on the gridiron, St. Thomas holds the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 43-36-2. The Tommies have owned the series as of late, winning each of the last five meetings, and eight of the last 10. Last season when these two teams met in St. Paul, St. Thomas jumped out to a 21-0 lead early in the third quarter on a 74-yard touchdown run by quarterback Matt O'Connell. The Gusties responded with a pair of touchdowns, the first of which was a 53-yard fumble return by Cory Colvard '13 with 11:31 to play in the third. Phillip Butler followed with a six-yard touchdown reception at the 9:22 mark of the fourth guarter to bring the score to 21-14, but a Brenton Braddock touchdown for St. Thomas with 5:51 to play would prove to be all the Tommies needed as they hung on for the 28-14 win.

Meet The Head Coaches... Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his fifth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 16-28 in his first four-plus seasons. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus. St. Thomas Head Coach Glenn Caruso is now in his sixth season at the head of the St. Thomas football program. In his five-plus years with the Tommies, Caruso has amassed an overall record of 60-9. A graduate of Ithaca College (N.Y.), Caruso is in his 17th year as a collegiate coach, making stops at the University of South Dakota, North Dakota State University, and Macalester before being named the head coach at St. Thomas in 2008.

About The Tommies... The St. Thomas football team, much like Gustavus, is coming off a win last Saturday when it defeated Carleton 65-6 in St. Paul. After throwing an interception on its first drive of the game, St. Thomas proceeded to score on each of its next six possessions to remove any doubt about the outcome of the game. The Tommies opened up a 65-0 lead before the Knights finally found the endzone with 5:28 left in the game. St. Thomas amassed 697 yards of total offense (354 rushing, 343 passing) and converted on 9 of 13 third downs to go along with 34 first downs in the game. Carleton was held to 153 yards of total offense (124 passing, 29 rushing), converted on 2 of 12 third-down attempts, and registered just eight first downs on the afternoon.

The Tommie offense has proven to be one of the most prolific in the MIAC through four games this season. St. Thomas leads the conference in total yards per game (496.5), passing yards per game (259.8), rushing yards per game (236.8), and first downs per game (27.0) The Tommies also rank second in the MIAC in scoring average, putting up an average of 40.0 points per contest.

St. Thomas's 3-4 defense sits atop the conference rankings in nearly every statistical category. The Tommies lead the league in points allowed per game (10.0), total yards (226.8), passing yards (155.0), rushing yards (71.8), and sacks (12).

Gusties Tackle Cancer... The Gustavus versus St. Thomas football game on Saturday will be designated as "Tackle Cancer Day" at Hollingsworth Field. The effort is a part of the Randy Shaver Cancer Research and Community Fund, whose mission is to support the cancer community in Minnesota by funding research, prevention, treatment, and other programs relating to Minnesota's cancer community. The Randy Shaver Cancer Research and Community Fund has challenged every high school and collegiate football team to sponsor at least one "Tackle Cancer" game during the months of September and October. Fans are encouraged to make donations towards funding additional cancer research during the game by giving to members of the Gustavus football volunteer staff, who will be making their way through the stands throughout the afternoon. Less than 10 percent of the monies raised are spent on administrative costs, making it one of the most efficient uses of your charitable donation. More than 300 high schools, colleges, and universities have already joined the initiative this year with more that \$120,000 expected to be raised.

Offense Ignites... In last week's win over Hamline, the Gustie offense ignited to score on each of its first seven possessions on the way to scoring 52 points. Saturday's point total is the highest in a game by a Gustavus team since Sept. 22, 2007, when the Gusties scored 57 points in a win over Hamline. The 52-point performance comes one week after scoring 45 points against St. Olaf in a 45-19 win on Sept. 28. The last time that the Gusties scored 40 or more points in consecutive weeks was in 2006 when they defeated Macalester 51-0 on Oct. 21, then turned around to beat Augsburg the next week by the final score of 41-27 on Oct. 28. That year, Gustavus proceeded to win its next two games to end the season on a four-game

MIAC Offensive Player-of-the-Week


Jeffrey Dubose, Gustavus St. Paul, Minn./St. Croix Lutheran

The Gustavus offense put up its second consecutive explosive performance in a 52-7 win over Hamline last week, thanks in large part the play of senior running back Jeffrey Dubose. Dubose tied a school record with five touchdowns in the game to go along with 215 yards of total offense (200 rushing, 15 receiving).

win-streak and finish the year 6-4 overall (4-4 MIAC).

Dubose Among Nation's Leaders... Running back Jeffrey Dubose is off to a stellar start in his senior season wearing the black and gold. Through four games, Dubose ranks second in all of NCAA Division III college football in rushing touchdowns with 11. He and Sean Dunning of Millikin University sit one score behind Dion Wiegand of Washington and Jefferson, who has 12 rushing touchdowns in five games. Dubose also ranks in the top 10 nationally in rushing yardage per game. After gaining 601 yards rushing on 98 carries for an average of 150.3 yards per contest, Jeffrey ranks ninth behind Trey Yocum of Monmouth University, who has run for an average of 151.8 yards per game. Domonique Hayden of Thomas More leads the nation in rushing average at 185.5 yards per game, while fellow MIAC running back Austin Duncan of Hamline ranks fourth in the country with an average of 163.3 yards per game.

Gusties Against the Top 25... In Head Coach Peter Haugen's four-plus years at the helm of the Gustavus football program, the Gusties have not defeated a team ranked in the top 25 in the D3football.com national rankings, a trend they will look to break on Saturday afternoon against the No. 6-ranked Tommies. During Haugen's tenure, Gustavus is 0-10 against top 25 teams. Of the 10 losses, four have come to St. Thomas. However, the Gusties have played the Tommies tough each of the last two years, losing by a final score of 20-7 at Hollingsworth Field in 2011 and falling 28-14 last season in St. Paul.

Seeing Red... After scoring on all five attempts in the red zone last weekend, the Gustavus offense is starting to see the color red. For the season, the Gusties have scored on 16 of their 19 opportunities inside the opponent's 20-yard line for a red zone conversion percentage of 84 percent. That mark ranks second in the MIAC behind Augsburg (89%), a welcomed improvement from ranking last in the league with a conversion rate of 74% last season. Of Gustavus's 16 scores in the red zone, 14 have been touchdowns.

Hendricks Hitting His Stride... After struggling in a 100-yard passing performance against Augsburg on Sept. 21, quarterback Mitch Hendricks has been on the mark each of the last two weeks. Hendricks, in just his third game calling signals for the Gusties, completed 29 of 38 passes for 301 yards and two touchdowns against St. Olaf on Sept. 28. He followed that performance by an even better one, completing 15 of 18 passes for 184

yards and a touchdown last weekend. During the two-week span, Hendricks completed 78.6 percent (44 of 56) of his passes for 485 yards (242.5 ypg) and three touchdowns compared to one interception. Hendricks currently ranks second in the MIAC in completion percentage with a mark of 68.6 percent (83 of 121) for the season.

Dubose Nearing History... With an outstanding start to his senior season, running back Jeffrey Dubose is nearing many career totals that would make Gustavus football history. For starters, Dubose has amassed 35 total touchdowns in his collegiate career, placing him second on the all-time touchdowns list, two shy of the record held by Jay Shoenebeck '80 and Ron Straka '81 with 37. Of Jeffrey's 35 touchdowns, 28 have come on the ground, which ranks tied for fourth on the career rushing touchdowns list. He is currently five touchdowns behind Straka, who rushed for 33 touchdowns from 1977-1980. On top of the scoring accolades, Dubose is also climbing the list of rushing yards leaders. With 2,561 yards, Jeffrey surpassed Jay Schoenebeck '80 and Brian Brekke '95 to move into sixth place on the list behind Travis Prunty '00, who is fifth with 2,750 yards.

Tough Road Ahead... Starting Saturday, the Gusties will embark on a difficult stretch of games to end the season. Over the next six weeks, Gustavus will play three teams currently ranked in the D3football.com Top 25, one team that has been in the poll earlier this season and is still receiving votes, and one team currently ranked in the NAIA Football Coaches' Top 25 Poll. This weekend's contest features a match up with No. 6 St. Thomas (3-1) before taking to the road next weekend against the 16th-ranked team in NAIA in Valley City State (4-1). The Gusties will then host Saint John's (4-1) on Oct. 26, which was ranked No. 21 in the D3football.com poll two weeks ago and is still receiving votes. Gustavus will host Carleton (2-2) the following week before finishing the year on Nov. 16 at Concordia (4-0), currently listed at No. 22. Those six teams have a combined record of 17-5 so far this year, making the remaining schedule a tough road to travel.

GUSTAVUS 14 ST. THOMAS 28

St. Paul, Minn. (3,750) O'Shaunessey Stadium 47 degrees, cloudy

St. Paul - The Gustavus Adolphus football team suffered a 28-14 loss to No. 3 St. Thomas on Saturday afternoon at O'Shaunessey Stadium. Despite cutting St. Thomas' lead to seven points (21-14) with nine minutes remaining in the game, a Gustavus interception followed by a Tommie touchdown turned out to be the difference in the game. Gustavus falls to 2-3 overall and 1-3 in the MIAC with the loss, while St. Thomas remains undefeated at 5-0 overall and 3-0 in the MIAC.

Gustavus' potent running game ran into its kryptonite in the form of the St. Thomas' 3-4 defensive front this afternoon. The Gustavus ground game, which was averaging over 250 yards per game coming into today, was held to a mere 32 total yards. Both quarterback Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) and Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) ran for 18 yards each to lead the Gusties.

The Tommies were the first to draw blood, taking advantage of a running in to the punter penalty on the opening drive and scoring four plays later to go up 8-0 after a successful two point conversion. St. Thomas quarterback Matt O'Connell completed a 35-yard post to Dan Noehring for the game's opening touchdown.

It would take until the final minute of the half before another point was added to the scoreboard. Following a Torey Asao (Jr., Chaska, Minn.) interception at the five-yard-line and a three and out by the Gustauvs offense, the Tommie offense took over at the Gustavus 43-var-line. O'Connell completed a 23-vard pass to Dan Ferrazzo before finding Kyle Whitley in the end zone for a touchdown from nine yards out two plays later. After the extra point, St. Thomas would head to the locker room with a 15-0 lead.

The Tommies opened up a 21-0 lead after forcing Gustavus to a three-and-out on its opening drive of the third quarter. O'Connell broke several tackles and before reversing his field and taking a keeper 74 yards for a touchdown.

After fumbling on their next possession, hope seemed to be all but lost for the Gusties. Thanks to an Anthony Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) sack and forced fumble, Gustavus received the momentum swing it needed. Cory Colvard (Sr., Centerville, Minn.) picked up the Boyce forced fumble and ran it back 53 yards for a Gustavus touchdown.

Gustavus intercepted O'Connell on St. Thomas' following two possessions, yet couldn't find a way to capitalize as the score would remain 21-7 by the start of the fourth quarter.

With under 10 minutes remaining in the game, Gustavus cut the lead to 21-14 on a six-yard touchdown from Mena to Butler. Mena's intended pass was knocked out of the hands of Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) before falling into the arms of Butler in the corner of the end zone.

The Gustavus defense would come up with another big stop on St. Thomas' next possession, gaining control of the ball at the GAC 33-yard-line with 6:49 on the clock. On second down and nine, Mena's pass was picked off Tremayn Williams and the Tommies took over at the 18-yard-line. Two plays later, Brenton Braddock added the insurance touchdown from four yards out to bring the score to a final at 28-14.

Gustavus totaled 187 yards compared to St. Thomas' 468 in the game. Mena was 17-for-25 with one touchdown and one interception through the air. His top target of the day was Hintze who brought in five catches for 62 yards.

A bright spot for the Gusties was the stellar turnover generation by the defense. Corey Shea's defensive unit recovered three fumbles and picked off three passes to finish +4 in turnover margin.

Anthony Boyce led the defensive effort with a game-high 14 tackles (11 solo) and a sack. Torey Asao intercepted two passes, while Dilger also had one pick.

St. Thomas quarterback Matt O'Connell was 20-for-34 for 220 yards and two touchdowns. He spread the ball around to eight different receivers over the course of the game. The sophomore was also the game's leading rusher, running for 149

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is entering his fifth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

In his fourth year as head coach, Haugen led the Gusties to a 3-7 record overall and a 2-6 mark within the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, finishing seventh in the league standings. In four-plus seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 16-28 and an MIAC record of 12-23. Last season, Gustavus received four all-conference selections in running back Jeffrey Dubose (St. Paul, Minn.), offensive lineman Brian Grundmeyer (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.), defensive lineman Donte Green (Minneapolis, Minn.), and linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.). Dubose earned first team distinction while Grundmeyer, Green, and Haas all earned a spot on the second team.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference this past year and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early 90s. In his senior year, he earned All-Conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 96-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a .580 winning percentage (468-336-21). The Gusties will soon join a very elite group of 37 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games. Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 29 players who have received All-America honors, 12 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently in 2012, senior safety Brad Kruckeberg was awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

SIMPSON 21 GUSTAVUS 28

St. Peter, Minn. (2,739) Hollingsworth Field 77°, Sunny

St. Peter, Minn. – The Gustavus Adolphus football team kicked off its 2013 season with a 28-21 victory over Simpson College Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. Trailing 7-0 late in the first half, the Gusties rattled off 28 unanswered points heading into the fourth quarter to take a 28-7 lead. Simpson did not go quietly, however, as the Storm scored twice in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven. In the end, the Gusties drained the remaining 2:29 on the final drive of the afternoon to hang on for the 28-21 win. Gustavus begins the season 1-0, while Simpson drops to 1-1.

"It's a great feeling to win a football game," remarked linebacker Joe Haas (Sr., Mission, Kan.). "We have been working towards this since last season, and to come out here and play like we did, it feels amazing."

After an empty outcome on its first possession, Simpson drove the ball 74 yards in seven plays and 2:44 to take an early 7-0 lead. A pair of big plays on the ground from Ethan Calvert and Tyler Kenny for gains of 17 yards and 23 yards, respectively, highlighted the drive, which was capped off by an eight-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Taylor Nelson to Ryan Olson.

On Simpson's next possession, Joe Haas recovered a fumbled snap for the first of what would be four straight turnovers between the two teams. The Gusties returned the favor two plays later with a fumble inside the Simpson five-yard line only to get it right back on an athletic interception by Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.). Three plays later it was Simpson's turn to force an interception and the flurry of turnovers was finished.

Gustavus threatened on each of its next two possessions, but could not find a way to put points on the scoreboard until the final :26 seconds of the half. Following a pair of 20-plus-yard completions, Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) carried off right tackle for a two-yard touchdown run to even the score at 7-7 heading into halftime.

"I think we did a nice job of keeping our composure in the first half when we weren't playing how we wanted to, especially on the offensive side of the ball," mentioned Dubose. "We stuck with it and took the momentum when we scored at the end of the half."

The 15-minute halftime break could do nothing to break the spirit of the newly rejuvenated Gusties. They proceeded to score on each of their first three possessions of the second half to open up a 28-7 lead midway through the third. On its opening drive following the break, Gustavus marched 69 yards down the field in 11 plays to score the half's opening touchdown on an 11-yard run by Jeffrey Dubose. On the play, Dubose surpassed the 2,000-yard rushing milestone, becoming just the 11th player to do so in the history of the Gustavus football program.

"It means a lot to me," admitted Dubose of his accomplishment. "A big reason why I have gotten this far is because of the coaches and my teammates. The coaches have kept their faith in me and my teammates have been willing to block for me. From the offensive line out to the receivers, it has really been a team thing. They put the yards in front of me and I just had to grab them."

The Gusties needed just two plays on the following drive, thanks to a 53-yard touchdown run by quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) that extended the Gustavus lead to 21-7. After Xavier Fust (Jr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) recovered a fumble inside the Simpson nine-yard line, Hendricks scored his second touchdown of the day with a four-yard touchdown run.

However, Simpson would not go quietly. In a 28-7 hole, Simpson came back to score two touchdowns in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven points. The Storm scored on a 35-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to Mike Kuhn to narrow the lead to 28-14 before Taylor fired another touchdown pass to Nate Connealy.

"Simpson has a great offense, we learned that last year, and they showed it today when they scored two touchdowns in two minutes," said Haas. "We held together as a defense and got the turnover we needed to make a stand on the goal line."

In the end, however, the Gusties drained the final 2:29 with the final drive of the game to hold on for the 28-21 win.

"We came out and moved the ball the first few drives of the second half and rode the momentum," added Dubose. "They came back at the end, but we just had to turn the page and get back on track. Sometimes you have lows during a game, but you have to stay steady. I think we did a good job of doing that."

Gustavus was led offensively by Mitch Hendricks. In his first start as a Gustie, Hendricks completed 27-of-42 passes for 222 yards and also carried the ball nine times for 57 yards and two touchdowns. He was joined in the ground game by Jeffrey Dubose, who carried 22 times for 75 yards and two touchdowns. Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) led all receivers with 11 catches for 53 yards.

Defensively, Joe Haas recorded seven tackles, while also forcing a fumble and recovering a fumble. Jake Forcier (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) registered five tackles and an interception on the day.

The Gusties will be back in action next Saturday when they travel to Minneapolis to take on Augsburg at 1:00 p.m. Even with the win, Head Coach Peter Haugen knows there is room for improvement heading into next week.

"I think we need to play cleaner," stated Haugen. "Offensively in the first half, there were plays to be made and we were close to making them but just couldn't seem to figure it out. We ended up doing that in the second half, but we need to play cleaner from the start."

GUSTAVUS 16 AUGSUBRG 19

Minneapolis (1,409) Edor Nelson Field 55°, Mostly Cloudy

Minneapolis – After leading on the scoreboard for nearly 44 consecutive minutes of game clock on Saturday, the Gustavus football team surrendered its lead to Augsburg late in the fourth quarter and would not get it back as it fell to the Auggies by a final score of 19-16 at Edor Nelson Field. Augsburg's game-winning drive required four plays to march 78 yards in :51 seconds to score the go-ahead touchdown with just 2:37 remaining. With the loss, Gustavus drops to 1-1 overall and begins Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) play 0-1. Augsburg improves to 2-0 and opens its MIAC schedule 1-0.

After receiving the opening kickoff, the Gustavus offense proceeded to control the remainder of the first quarter. The Gusties dominated the time of possession battle, controlling the ball for 11:03 of the opening 15 minutes. Following an interception on its first drive, Gustavus took over at the 12:30 mark and would not give the ball up until there was just 3:47 remaining in the quarter, rattling off a 16-play, 58-yard drive that began at its own 10-yard line. However, the Gusties came up empty-handed when they failed to convert on fourth down in Augsburg territory. Because of the dominance in possession, the Gustie defense was able to hold the Augsburg offense to just 29 total yards in the opening quarter compared to 104 yards for Gustavus.

The Gustavus offense chewed up another 3:30 to begin the second quarter before Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) got the Gusties on the scoreboard with a two-yard touchdown run. The touchdown capped a nine-play, 91-yard drive that was highlighted by a 45-yard carry from Dubose on the first play of the second frame. The senior's two-yard score was his third touchdown of the season and gave the Gusties a 7-0 lead following a Tom Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point.

Augsburg answered with a touchdown of its own on the ensuing possession. A 45-yard kickoff return to the Gustavus 49-yard line by Tyrell Martin set up what would be a 12-play, 49-yard drive that was capped by an 11-yard touchdown pass from Auggie quarterback Ayrton Scott, who accounted for all 49 yards on the drive (27 pass, 22 rush), to Joey Sonnenfeld. With the Gusties now leading 7-6, a rare turn of events ensued on the point-after attempt. The extra point try was blocked by Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.) and returned all the way to the endzone by Beau Bachman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) to give Gustavus two points on what should have been the game-tying extra point. As it stood, the Gusties took a 9-6 lead to halftime, as neither team was able to put any more points on the board before the break.

After forcing a three-and-out on the Augsburg's first possession of the second half, Gustavus came out to score on its opening drive of the third quarter. Beginning on their own 32-yard line, the Gusties drove 68 yards in nine plays to take a 16-6 lead. Carrying the workload throughout the day, Jeffrey Dubose carried the ball seven times for 48 yards on the drive, 12 of them coming on his second touchdown run of the afternoon.

Just as in the first half, Augsburg again had the answer in the third quarter. The Auggies marched 75 yards in nine plays, highlighted by a 45-yard completion from Ayrton Scott to Phil Putratz that would have spotted the ball inside the Gustavus five-yard line were it not for a personal foul penalty assessed to Augsburg. The Auggies were not to be denied, however, and put the ball in the endzone on the second scoring connection between Scott and Joey Sonnenfeld, this time from 10 yards out.

Augsburg threatened again late in the third and into the fourth on a 15-play, 50-yard drive that stretched over 4:54 of game clock, but the drive stalled at the Gustavus 13-yard line when the Auggies failed to convert on fourth down

Gustavus could not pass midfield on either of its next two drives, as the Augsburg punting unit pinned the Gusties deep in their own territory in both situations. After eating up 7:53 on its second drive of the quarter, Gustavus was forced to punt on fourth down and 16 yards to go.

Cameron Cropsey led the way for the Gustavus defense with eight tackles and an interception. Cameron Cropsey led the way for the Gustavus defense with eight tackles and an interception.

Augsburg took over on its own 22-yard line and four plays later owned a 19-16 lead. A 21-yard completion to Sonnenfeld, a 12-yard run by Scott set the Auggies up for a 46-yard touchdown on a screen pass to Phil Putratz to give Augsburg its first lead of the game with 2:37 to play. The Gusties began what would be their final possession at their own 41-yard line, but a key fumble on the first play of the drive put the seal on the outcome as the Auggies were able to milk the remaining 2:24 and wrap up the 19-16 victory.

"We went into the game thinking we had to contain their quarterback and run the ball well. We did both of those today," commented Head Coach Peter Haugen. "I thought we did a great job of limiting what their quarterback was able to do on the ground. We wanted to make him beat us with his arm, and Augsburg was able to make enough plays in the passing game to do that."

For the game, Gustavus running back Jeffrey Dubose carried 37 times for a career-high 227 yards. His performance ties the Gustavus record for most carries in a game, while his 227 rushing yards rank seventh on the all-time single-game rushing yards list, 31 yards behind the record of 258 yards set by Ray Wilson `09 against Augsburg in 2008.

Through the air, Gustavus quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) completed 12 of 23 passes for 100 yards and was sacked twice on the day. Gustavus' leading receiver was Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) for the second week in a row. Butler hauled in four receptions for 34 yards.

"We have to score more points," Haugen put simply. "Jeffrey did a great job running the ball today and our guys up front were terrific, but we weren't as effective in our passing game as we needed to be. Augsburg did a good job punting the football, so we played on a long field for a good part of the day, but we just weren't as sharp as we needed to be."

Defensively, Cameron Cropsey (Jr., Eagan, Minn.) led the way for the Gusties. Cropsey registered eight total tackles (4 solo) and intercepted a pass on the day. Travis Pepper (Jr., Overland Park, Kan.) came next with 7 tackles (2 solo), while Beau Bachman recorded the lone sack on the day.

Quarterback Ayrton Scott led the way for the Auggies offensively. Scott accounted for 258 yards through the air and 56 more on the ground. He also tallied three passing touchdowns on the day, two of which connected with Joey Sonnenfeld, who caught a total of four passes for 66 yards. Phil Putratz led all receivers in the game with five catches for 104 yards and a touchdown.

Michael Juberian led the Augsburg defense in the game. Juberian registered 18 tackles (5 solo) on the day. Felix Coleman joined him with double-digit tackles, notching 10 total (6 solo) on the afternoon.

The two teams were nearly identical in most offensive categories. Gustavus claimed 21 first downs compared to Augsburg's 19, while the Auggies outgained the Gusties in total yardage by a single yard. Augsburg gained 353 yards on 68 offensive plays in comparison to 352 yards on 71 plays for Gustavus. However, the key difference proved to be Gustavus' two turnovers, one of which came on its final drive of the game, compared to just one for Augsburg.

ST. OLAF 19 GUSTAVUS 45

St. Peter, Minn. (3,144) Hollingsworth Field 54°, Partly Cloudy

St. Peter, Minn. – After trailing 13-7 at the outset of the second quarter, the Gustavus football team rattled off 38 unanswered points to capture a 45-19 victory over St. Olaf on Homecoming Saturday at Hollingsworth Field. The Gusties racked up over 400 yards of total offense and came up with four interceptions of St. Olaf quarterback Nate Penz on their way to the 26-point win. Gustavus improves to 2-1 overall and 1-1 in the MIAC, while St. Olaf falls to 1-3 overall and 1-2 in the MIAC.

"It means a lot to play like we did today," said Head Coach Peter Haugen. "We talked about it being a 'hinge' moment for us all week, and I think the biggest thing was that you could see our guys had energy and they kept believing. It was just a great team effort. I felt like each guy did what they're being asked to do. We had a lot of energy and it was certainly a big win for us."

On the first possession of the game, with St. Olaf's punting unit in place, Gustavus cornerback Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) committed a roughing-the-kicker penalty that gave the Oles a first down and kept the drive alive. On the very next play, Dilger made up for his wrongdoing by pulling down his first of two interceptions on the day near midfield. The Gustie offense proceeded to march 53 yards in eight plays on its first possession of the game, which was capped off by an Aaron O'Gorman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) 10-yard touchdown run. O'Gorman's first career touchdown gave the Gusties the early 7-0 lead at the 8:30 mark of the first guarter.

"St. Olaf is a big rivalry game for us, so the whole week the intensity was building up to today," said Dilger. "We were ready to go, so it was nice to come out here and get off to a fast start."

St. Olaf responded with two touchdowns in the next two minutes, the first of which was a 55-yard strike from Nate Penz to Joel Reinhardt. After the Gustavus kickoff landed out-of-bounds, the Oles needed just three plays to tie the game at 7-7. On the second play of the ensuing Gustavus drive, quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) made his only mistake of the day, throwing an interception at his own 30-yard line. After a two-yard return, the Oles took over at the Gustavus 28 and wasted little time in reaching the endzone. St. Olaf scored two plays later with a 9-yard pass from Penz to Jake Schmiesing. The extra point failed to keep the score at 13-7 in favor of the Oles. St. Olaf would threaten again late in the first quarter, but a Dilger interception in his own endzone would extinguish all hope of extending the lead any further before the quarter break.

As if it were a ticking time-bomb, the Gustavus offense exploded with production in the second quarter. The Gusties got the ball back with 11:08 remaining in the frame and would proceed to score on six of its next seven possessions to score 38 unanswered points. Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) kicked things off with his first of three touchdown runs on the day. Just over four minutes later, Hendricks found Jordan Rudenick (Sr., Nicollet, Minn.) down a seam in the middle of the field after a play-action fake. Rudenick bulled his way across the goal line to give Gustavus a 21-13 lead with 2:17 to play in the opening half. Two plays later, the Gusties had the ball back after Kellan Euerle (Sr., St. Cloud, Minn.) intercepted a pass on the first play of the next St. Olaf drive. Gustavus took over at its own 38-yard line and after methodically moving the ball down the field, a Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) field goal with :17 seconds left in the half put the Gusties on top 24-13 heading to the break.

"In the first quarter we were getting settled in," said Matt Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.). "We needed to see what they were running defensively and adjust accordingly, so we threw some different formations at them. By the second, we had it figured out and our coaches did a great job with our play-calling."

Boyce provided a spark coming out of the break. The sophomore returned the opening second half kickoff 61 yards to the St. Olaf 28-yard line. Five plays later, Dubose scored his second touchdown of the afternoon to extend the lead to 31-13 with 12:49 to play in the third quarter. Boyce followed four minutes later with an incredible diving catch in the endzone on the ensuing possession. Matt made an adjustment on a deep ball thrown over the top of his head toward the sideline and still managed to keep a foot in-bounds to put the Gusties on top 38-13. Dubose would cap Gustavus' scoring output for the day on his third and final touchdown of the afternoon, a one-yard run with 9:42 left in regulation that brought the score to 45-13. St. Olaf would score on the final play of the game to cut the lead to 45-19, but it was too little, too late for the Oles as the Gusties walked away with the 26-point victory.

On the day, the Gustavus offense amassed 433 yards of total offense (301 passing, 132 rushing). Mitch Hendricks led the way through the air, completing 29 of 39 passes for 301 yards and two touchdowns. His favorite target, Matt Boyce, hauled in 13 passes for 150 yards and a touchdown. Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) came next with nine catches for 71 yards. Jeffrey Dubose tallied three touchdowns and 99 yards in the ground game on 23 carries.

"We knew coming in that they play a lot of cover three and we could attack them with certain routes, so we worked on those all week," mentioned Boyce. "Our scout defense was phenomenal, especially our secondary. They are a huge part of our success today because of their work hammering it out during practice all week."

Defensively, the Gusties held St. Olaf to 282 total yards (207 passing, 75 rushing) and forced four turnovers, all of which were interceptions led by Zach Dilger with two. Kellan Euerle and Nick Frandsen also recorded a pick on the day. Gustavus also sacked St. Olaf quarterback Nate Penz three times for a total of 29 yards lost. Cameron Cropsey (Jr., Eagan, Minn.), Anthony Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.), and Xavier Fust (Jr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) all had one sack each.

"They have great receivers, and they were really hurting us in the first quarter with the intermediate passing game," stated Haugen of his defense's play. "We switched some things up, gave their quarterback a few different looks defensively, played a little man-to-man, and I think that really helped us."

Gustavus will now look to carry the win into next week's contest against Hamline. "We need to bring the same kind of focus we brought this week into next week's practices," finished Dilger. "We can't take a step back. We have to keep moving forward with more focus and determination and we will get it done next Saturday."

Haugen echoed his junior cornerback's mindset, "Moving forward, we need to demonstrate that we are a mature football team," finished Haugen. "If you have one solid week, a mature team follows it up with another solid week, so I think that needs to be the message this week. We need to continue to grow, be critical of mistakes that we have and fix those mistakes, and play cleaner."

The Gusties will be back in action next Saturday, Oct. 5th when they travel to St. Paul to take on Hamline for a 1:00 p.m. kick off at Klas Field.

GUSTAVUS 52 HAMLINE

St. Paul (1,533) Klas Field 60°, Mostly Cloudy

St. Paul - Following an interception by Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) on Hamline's opening drive, the Gustavus football team put its foot on the gas and would not let off until late in the third quarter on its way to a 52-7 victory over Hamline on Saturday afternoon at Klas Field. The Gustavus offense scored on all six of its possessions of the first half and its opening two drives in the second half to open up a 52-0 lead before Hamline scored in the fourth guarter to bring the final score to 52-7. With the win, Gustavus improves to 3-1 overall and 2-1 in the MIAC, while the Pipers fall to 1-3 overall and 0-3 in the MIAC.

"We have been talking a lot about momentum and carrying things over to the next week," said junior safety Jake Forcier (Watkins, Minn.). "The big goal for us was to go 1-0 this week. That has been the motto throughout the year: go 1-0 every week. Last week was big win for us, but this week was a different opponent and I think we did a good job of focusing solely on Hamline this week."

After allowing the Hamline offense to pick up a pair of first downs on its opening drive, Zach Dilger came down with an interception off a tipped ball and returned it 30 yards to the Hamline 48-yard line to set up the Gustavus offense. The Gusties would not let the opportunity go to waste, as Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) connected on a 30-yard field goal to give the Gusties a 3-0 lead with 10:29 to play in the opening

"Coach Shea has preached fast and physical defense all year, and that starts up front" continued Forcier. "Our d-line has been doing a great job of getting it done and getting after the quarterback. That makes it easy on us in the secondary. When they force quarterbacks out of the pocket, they are uncomfortable and that allows us to get tips on some passes, which Dilger took advantage of today with his pick."

After holding Hamline to 16 yards on the next possession, the Gusties drove 85 yards in nine plays to cross the goal line and take a 10-0 lead. Gustavus converted a key third down on the drive when guarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) completed a 38-yard strike down the sideline to receiver George Buchner (Fr., Excelsior, Minn.) on third-and-11 that kept the possession alive. The drive was capped off by Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) when he took a handoff and went up-and-over the pile from one yard out.

The Gusties got the ball back three plays later and proceeded to score once more on a Dubose touchdown run, this time from four yards out. Gustavus again converted on a key third down on the drive with a completion from Hendricks to Buchner to push the offense on to take a 17-0 lead.

"Our offense played really well today and I think it was our ability to convert on third down that was the difference in the game," acknowledged Head Coach Peter Haugen. "Early on we were forced to convert a couple of third and long situations, which gave us some confidence right from the start."

From there, the Gusties controlled the remainder of the half, scoring on each of its next three drives to end the second quarter. Dubose scored from 28 yards out after breaking two tackles and cutting to the outside where he outraced everyone to the pylon to push the lead to 24-0. On the ensuing kickoff, Hamline kick returner Hovfal Adam fumbled on his own five vard line where Beau Bachman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) snatched the ball off the bounce and took it home for the score. Dubose capped the half of scoring with an eight-yard touchdown reception off a screen pass out of the backfield to extend the lead to 38-0 with just :25 seconds remaining in the half. The scored capped an 11-play, 94-yard drive that took just 4:32.

It took just two plays out of halftime for Dubose to break off a 57-vard touchdown run to put the Gusties in front 45-0. The touchdown put an end to the afternoon for the offensive starters, as they would turn the reigns over the second team, which in turn scored on its first possession in the game. Aaron O'Gorman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) scored his second touchdown of the season on a five-vard run with 8:08 to play in the third before the Gusties were forced to punt for the first time all afternoon on the next possession with just over 2:00 remaining in the quarter.

Hamline's Austin Duncan scored on a three-yard touchdown run midway through the fourth quarter, but it was far too late for the Pipers in the 45-point loss.

For the game, Gustavus racked up 489 yards of total offense (230 passing, 259 rushing) in the 52-point performance. However, the key on the stat sheet was a 67-percent (8-for-12) conversion rate on third down, while not turning the ball over. Running back Jeffrey Dubose led the way for the Gusties with 200 yards on

16 attempts (12.5 avg) to go along with four touchdowns on the ground. Dubose also caught two passes for 15 yards and another touchdown through the air to bring his touchdown total to five on the day. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks was on point all afternoon, completing 15-of-18 passes (83.3%) for 184 yards and a touchdown. His favorite target was Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) caught seven passes for 60 yards on the day.

Although dominant in the first half, the Gustavus defense allowed over 100 yards rushing for the first time this season, as Hamline ran for 154 vards. However, the Pipers were held to just 61 vards rushing in the first two quarters. Hamline also gained 109 yards passing for 263 total yards on the day. Individually, Lucas Kleinschrodt (Sr., Alden, Minn.) led the way with 10 tackles (5 solo), while Zach Dilger raked in an interception and Beau Bachman recovered a fumble for a touchdown.

Gustavus will next host the University of St. Thomas on Saturday. Oct. 12th for family weekend and Coach to Cure MD in St. Peter. That kick off is set for 1:00 p.m. on Saturday. More information on Coach to Cure MD will be available later in the week.

"I think it comes back to how we handle this success," finished Haugen. "Similar to this week, we need to be a mature team, stay focused, and be critical of ourselves so we can continue to get better and grow as a football team."
